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The Results of the “A Tree for Life” - Art Competition

The “A Tree for Life” open student art competition was organised by the Eco2adapt project in collaboration with ENO Schoolnet as part of the ENO Tree Planting Day 2026 “Plant Trees – Grow Superheroes” campaign activities. In their artworks, students were invited to express their ideas about and appreciation for trees, forests, and nature through art. The students explored what a “tree for life” means to them and what kind of stories a tree can tell about life on Earth.

The competition period was from 22 April to 31 May, with an additional three-week extension for submitting artworks. The competition received a total of 22 artworks from students around the world. The technique used for creating the artworks was free; students could draw, paint, or design their work in their own style. However, AI-generated images were not accepted.

The competition had two categories:

1. **Grades 1–6;** students aged 7–12 years (**12 artworks**)
2. **Grades 7–9;** students aged 12–16 years (**10 artworks**)

The jury consisted of Eco2adapt project specialists from the Finnish Forest Centre and the University of Eastern Finland, as well as an environmental education specialist from ENO Schoolnet. The artworks were evaluated based on three criteria: artistry, originality and story.
